Reasons for Decision (provide detailed justification referring to central issues presented in the round, for debaters and their coaches):

Affirmative: Please work on the clarity of your delivery. The tag lines were jumbled in the presentation of the plan. In cross-examination Dave needs to work on lowering the volume of his voice. Additionally, the affirmative should work on getting some more up-to-date files.

Negative: Pretty balanced teamwork in the round. Clear and consistent development of your offense. The coverage of the inherency was sufficient, but could have been a bit clearer.

At the end of the round I end up voting for the negative. First, the counterplan's argument about the benefits of the executive order on presidential powers is carried throughout the round. The evidence the affirmative read against this was under developed and outdated compared to what the negative offered. Additionally, the negative is ahead on the solvency take outs to the affirmative plan. The Ferguson evidence was particularly powerful on that part of the flow.
